UNIFORMS

At McCarthy we are part of a community, therefore students are expected to be proud members of our community by wearing the appropriate uniform with pride.

MATHS IS FUN

There are many online Mathematics sites for students to practise Mathematic and Numeracy related skills. Many of these sites make learning and revision fun. Why not consistently practice your skills these holidays!

BUS CHANGES

Students travelling on **bus 4567**, need to have a temporary pass for the remainder of the term. Students have been made aware of this change. If a student needs to go into Penrith but does not travel on this bus usually, they can receive a bus pass from Mrs Deschamps. The student will need to have a note explaining the reason from their parent.

Students who travel on **bus 795** must travel from school on the bus towards Warragamba. Students will not be permitted to travel on bus 4567 to the station and connect with bus 795. Students attempting to enter the bus at the station will be monitored and their bus pass confiscated.

EXAMS

As your children begin to bring home marked exams, some students will be happy with results, whilst others might be disappointed. It is helpful to take some time to talk with them - providing an opportunity for them to talk about how they feel. Where possible, go through marked exams, looking at the questions and answers, talking about how they interpreted the questions and how they demonstrated their response.

- *Go through the exam paper, underlining key words and instructions with your child*
- *Highlight correct responses, words or ideas in their responses*
- *Discuss additional responses, ideas, words*
- *Talk about the wording of the questions - did they understand the address and what the question was really asking*
- *With questions that were incorrect, talk about what the correct answers could be - "google" ideas, answers if you are unsure*
- *Write correct ideas, words, responses together in a different colour on the paper*
- *File these papers for reference next year when preparing for exams*
- *Discuss the importance of classwork and application throughout the year - study should be revision, not new information*
- *Remind your child that the exams are just one form of assessment and that whilst important, are a way of seeing what they know at the moment and how to move forward.*

TRADE TRAINING CENTRE

Over the past two weeks, we have welcomed schools from across the Parramatta Diocese; Patrician Brother's Blacktown, St Patricks' Marist Dundas and Parramatta Marist College, as they have taken advantage of the TTC facilities to complete bricklaying competencies as part of their HSC Construction delivery.
