As teachers, both data and research play a significant role in informing the majority, if not, all of our teaching at McCarthy Catholic College. The Catholic Education Office, Parramatta has trained and facilitated it's English and Mathematics staff members in a valuable course over the past 2 years titled EM4. This course stands for English and Mathematics Stage 4 and is aimed at specific teaching strategies that teachers are to employ for Year 7 and 8 students to improve their literacy and numeracy. My role as the EM4 Coordinator, is to assist all staff members implement these strategies into their teaching programs and lesson plans. This year, our data has informed us that our students lack in their comprehension skills. So as a school initiative, EM4 is focusing on the Super Six Comprehension strategies. This is a very positive move forward towards improving our student's reading and understanding; and we hope to work together with our parents to assist in our student's improvement.
